
Do join us for any of our Christmas services this year – we'd love to see you! And I pray for a peaceful Christmas and New Year for you all.

New Way to Give to the Church − Parish Giving Scheme 🐣

Direct Debit via the Parish Giving Scheme has arrived as a way to give to the church. This has many advantages including:

- It is a tried and tested scheme that allows givers to donate to the church by regular Direct Debit payments. It is the only payment method with a money back guarantee and is therefore safer for the donor than Standing Orders, cheques and cash.
- It has been found to be a simple method of giving, the gifts/donations are reliable and regular, and it helps churches plan for the future. Giving is reviewed annually with the givers, with an option for an inflationary increase.
- The scheme means that less money is handled in the church, which is safer for the volunteers and their time spent counting and banking the money is reduced. Bank charges may reduce as well.
- As more and more givers switch to direct debit with the Parish Giving Scheme, it
 will save many hours of administrative time at local church level. Gifts/donations
 are much easier for the Gift Aid Secretary to reconcile than standing orders or cash.
 It will also improve cash flow, since Gift Aid is claimed and added each month by
 the PGS team (rather than claimed annually by the Parish).
- There are no direct costs to a participating parish.

The Dedicated Telephone Service

Donors may prefer the option of setting up their Direct Debit by using the dedicated PGS telephone service. To do this donors should call: **0333 002 1271** Lines are open Monday to Friday, 9 - 5pm.

One of the PGS administrators will take the donor through the sign-up process – this normally takes around 15 minutes. The donor will need the following information to hand:

- Personal bank account details
- The name of the parish they wish to donate to
- They will need to confirm if they want to increase their gift in line with inflation each year
- Confirm if they are eligible for Gift Aid
- The PGS code for their parish 460646511

You may have noticed that the bells sounded different on Remembrance Sunday! To produce a sombre effect the bells are half-muffled. This is accomplished by attaching a muffle to the bell clapper (as seen in the photographs). All six bells in St Helen's have a large metal clapper suspended inside it, which swings from one side of the bell to the other as we ring and strikes the bell very hard. While the bells are

muffled, every other strike makes a softer note. This is ideal when ringing for Remembrance Sunday, funerals and during periods of mourning when a monarch dies.

The Muffles

The muffles are made from a square of thick leather with carpet attached to the inside. The oldest ones at Sandal are around 100 years old. While historically leather thongs were used to attach the muffles, we now use plastic cable ties. When installing the muffles we must crawl under bells which are located at the very top of the tower. This process takes about an hour.

Ringing

We have some special methods that we

ring for Remembrance. Echo ringing is where a regular method is rung but every stroke is doubled, which means when the bells are muffled it creates an echo effect. "Stand for Tenor" is where all the bells stop ringing apart from the Bell 6 (also known as the Tenor), the heaviest bell in the tower. This allows it to ring out once by itself before all the other bells join back in. This is repeated several times.

We are always looking for more ringers at Sandal, so if you know somebody who might be interested, please don't hesitate to contact us.

Christians Against Poverty

We took our team of ten volunteers outfor afternoon tea at the end of November. Andy Owen is one of these, and supports us with administrative work. He has taken on the task of putting together the Christmas hampers for our clients, which we really appreciate. Members of the Shield Youth Group at St. Helen's helped assemble them. There will be 20 hampers, giving an indication of the number of clients we are in touch with at any time.

We are also grateful to those who give financially to keep the Debt Centre running: Local business owners, St. George's Church, Connect City Church and The Spring. If you give money to St. Helen's and St. Paul's then you too are helping to support this work because the church allocates a regular amount to this service. In January we will be inviting representatives of our donors to an information session over afternoon tea.

To give a few figures, spanning the past year:

- 14 of our clients are going through insolvency, or have done so and are debt free;
- 3 are on a debt repayment plan;
- 6 not yet reached the stage where a decision is made about their route out of debt;
- 11 accounts have been closed.

An account may be closed because after a preliminary visit, the client realises they don't need the services of CAP and can manage their debts themselves.

Each of these clients has an individual story, and a person is usually finding life extremely stressful by the time they contact CAP. It is a privilege to be able to begin to alleviate some of the pressure they are feeling, and often, in time, to help remove a great burden. If you would like to contribute financially to the work of CAP, we can let you have a "Lifechanger" form, just ring one of us (have a look around in church too – we'll try to make some available there).

A statement by Bishop Nick on the Archbishop of Canterbury's resignation

The Rt Revd Nick Baines (Bishop of Leeds) has issued the following statement in response to the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Most Reverend Justin Welby:



"I respect the decision by the Archbishop of Canterbury to resign his office. In doing so, he takes personal and institutional responsibility for the Church of England's failures in relation to safeguarding. The Makin review made for very sobering reading.

"My concern now is to ensure that safeguarding practice in the Diocese of Leeds is the best it can be and that we improve where we lack. The focus in all of this must be the support of survivors of abuse. They remain in my prayers, as do the Archbishop and his family."
