
From our Vicar, Revd Hannah Smith Dear Everyone,

Christmas Bells

Our team of bell ringers enjoyed a sociable evening on one of our practice nights just before Christmas, having 'a go' ringing the handbells (instead of a regular practice with the tower bells)

This was a new experience for many of the team and caused much hilarity. As well as 'trying our hand' at learning a new skill to ring 'Rounds', 'Call Changes' and 'Plain Hunt' just as we would with the tower bells, we also rang the Christmas song 'Jingle Bells'

Whilst we only rang a dozen of the bells that we have, the book 'A Yorkshire Parish And It's People' (by Brenda Andrassy & Mary Ingham) records that we have 'a good set' of 56 Hand Bells which were purchased for £21.0.0 (That's 21 pounds 0 shillings 0 pence for those who remember the 'old money'!) However, looking at the records, there do appear to be some inconsistencies, as there are in fact just 55 bells purchased on two separate occasions, in 1880, at a cost of £12.10s.0d and £6.17s.6d which totals £19.7s.6d

The bells range chromatically (think of the black keys and the white keys on a keyboard) from the largest & lowest note bell (needing 2 hands to ring) note F; measuring 21cm in diameter to the smallest & highest note bell being a tiny 5cm in diameter, note C.

We hope you have enjoyed hearing the bells over the Christmas and New Year period.



Would you like to come and have a go? Come up the tower to watch and listen on a Sunday morning or on practice night, which is Wednesday (7.30pm to 9pm) You'd be very welcome to come and join in our fun and friendly group trying to keep a traditional skill alive.



Report of the Deanery Synod Meeting 12th Nov 2024

The meeting was at St Catherine's Church, Belle Vue. There were 30 people in attendance (24 laity and 6 clergy-including Revd Hannah Smith and Mike Keeton from Sandal Magna). Revd David Gerrard (Area Dean) welcomed everyone to the meeting and led prayers. There was a reading -Isaiah 5. 25-end which talks of God being displeased with his now dissolute people and causing their land to be invaded by more warlike peoples as a sort of punishment.

The speaker was the Ven. Catherine ('Cat') Thatcher-Archdeacon of Pontefract (which covers Wakefield). She mentioned the appointment of the Bishop of Wakefield (Area). Scheduled interviews will begin in January; announcement in March; consecration in June. Cat gave a quick rundown of her career to date (published in this Newsletter when she was installed last May). She is driven by a desire for social justice, discipleship and developing spirituality. She is learning about the Wakefield area and notices that there are quite a few new housing developments and wonders how the Church can reach out to the people in these developments. She asked the meeting to discuss between themselves what ideas they might have on that subject. There were quite a few fanciful ideas: a pantomime, opening up for Halloween, serve hot chocolate and hot dogs, chocolate bingo, young people's after school drop-in with toast, a men's club (in a pub). There were some more serious ideas: sending informative Christmas/Easter cards, use of Facebook.

Authors note: the Cof E is a geographical, national organisation and these new housing developments must be in a parish. Really it is up to the incumbent of that parish to inform the inhabitants of that fact-probably by information cards.

There was then some **Deanery Synod business:**

Election of one clergy and one lay rep for the 'Area Mission and Pastoral Committee'.

Clergy member Revd David Teasdale; Lay Member Tabitha Tanna.

Approval of the Minutes of the last meeting.

Kathryn Goldsmith elected to the Diocesan Committee.

Matt and Lizzy Brothwood new curates in the Deanery.

Clergy vacancy-St Michael's (Westgate End).

Reminder re clergy elections for General Synod.

Mike Keeton-Leeds rep of the Prayer Book Society gave information on the 'Cranmer Awards' and distributed some leaflets on the subject.

The meeting closed with Compline led by Revd David Gerrard.


